¹³ *And when the south wind blew softly, supposing that they had obtained [their] purpose, loosing [thence], they sailed close by Crete. ¹⁴ But not long after there arose against it a tempestuous wind, called Euroclydon. ¹⁵ And when the ship was caught, and could not bear up into the wind, we let [her] drive. ... ²⁰ And when neither sun nor stars in many days appeared, and no small tempest lay on [us], all hope that we should be saved was then taken away.*

Acts 27:13-15,20 KJV

I. I must see Rome!

A. You will survive Euroclydon, for your life word is not yet fulfilled.

B. Peter in prison (John 21:18,19; Acts 12:6-9)

[Jhn 21:18-19 KJV] ¹⁸ *Verily, verily, I say unto thee, When thou wast young, thou girdedst thyself, and walkedst whither thou wouldest: but when thou shalt be old, thou shalt stretch forth thy hands, and another shall gird thee, and carry [thee] whither thou wouldest not. ¹⁹ This spake he, signifying by what death he should glorify God. And when he had spoken this, he saith unto him, Follow me.*

[Act 12:6-9 KJV] ⁶ *And when Herod would have brought him forth, the same night Peter was sleeping between two soldiers, bound with two chains: and the keepers before the door kept the prison. ⁷ And, behold, the angel of the Lord came upon [him], and a light shined in the prison: and he smote Peter on the side, and raised him up, saying, Arise*

up quickly. And his chains fell off from [his] hands. ⁸ And the angel said unto him, Gird thyself, and bind on thy sandals. And so he did. And he saith unto him, Cast thy garment about thee, and follow me. ⁹ And he went out, and followed him; and wist not that it was true which was done by the angel; but thought he saw a vision.

C. Paul in the middle of his fourth shipwreck.

(Acts 23:11;19:21;27:24)

[Act 23:11 KJV] ¹¹ And the night following the Lord stood by him, and said, Be of good cheer, Paul: for as thou hast testified of me in Jerusalem, so must thou bear witness also at Rome.

[Act 19:21 KJV] ²¹ After these things were ended, Paul purposed in the spirit, when he had passed through Macedonia and Achaia, to go to Jerusalem, saying, After I have been there, I must also see Rome.

[Act 27:24 KJV] ²⁴ Saying, Fear not, Paul; thou must be brought before Caesar: and, lo, God hath given thee all them that sail with thee.
